Dear ones,

I am still in Ocean Springs, doing the same things. I continue to progress--slowly, but steadily. My main goal is to drive again; I continue to do well, and I hope to cross that finish line in a month or so; what a day that will be.

Susan and I continue to teach the weekly Bible class, doing selected book studies. As you probably know, Ezra, Nehemiah and Esther constitute a trilogy, telling the story of the final return of the Israelites from Babylonian/Persian captivity, about 500-400 BC. We studied Esther first, because the events in Esther occur during the times of both Ezra and Nehemiah, which are chronological. We finished Esther, have just finished Ezra, and will now begin Nehemiah. The class members are great; they love to learn, and, as always, we teach each other.

Some Things I have Learned through the years.

I have been in the ministry of Christian teaching and writing since the beginning with 6 (or was it 8?) hungry people in Jerry and June Thomas's living room in Obion County, Tennessee in 1976. I have travelled from coast to coast, and to several foreign countries, to teach the Bible and, on rare occasions, to preach.

I was for years active in the Christian Booksellers Association and the National Religious Broadcasters, lived and moved in that world, have appeared many times on secular and Christian radio and television. Through the years I came to know many of the people in that world, both prominent and obscure, leaders of huge ministries with international

outreach, and men and women with small ministries, small budgets and small circles of influence.

I say these things only to make the point that I have been able to know and observe many of the people in that world; and, in the process, I have learned some things. One of them, of which I am thoroughly convinced, is that the larger and more "successful" a ministry becomes, the greater the temptations to become corrupt. We have all seen regrettable examples of this. It is not easy to survive "success."

Another thing of which I have become convinced is that (with notable, godly exceptions) small ministries, with small budgets and limited resources, change more lives, in proportion to the dollars available to them, proclaiming and teaching the Truth of God, helping the needy with Bibles, books and other publications, than do most huge ministries, with huge budgets, huge staffs, private jets, expensive cars, bodyguards, and walled estates.

Such a small and vital ministry is Tom Adcock's Jesus People Information Center in Sacramento, California. He and his family preach in the street, witness and pass out tracts at public gatherings, including those that are celebrations of sodomy and abortion. He provides free Bibles and Bible studies to men and women in prisons. And (when he has enough money) he irregularly publishes a no-nonsense, free newsletter.

Ed had a brilliant, logical mind, and was a crusader for truth. His newsletter featured carefully crafted scriptural teachings, and verbatim exchanges with those who wrote to him, many of whom took issue with what he had written. He seemed never to tire of it; I couldn't have done it.

I know that his Lord welcomed him into Paradise with "Well done, good and faithful servant." His wife, Dawn, has moved to Georgia to be near one of their children; she will join him in God's time.
